Mark particularly focuses on major infrastructure, engineering and energy projects, advising clients through all stages of a project from procurement strategy to drafting and negotiating construction contracts and ancillary project documentation.

Examples of Mark’s expertise include:

- advising Nexans on its agreement with ScottishPower Renewables to supply and install 100km of high-voltage subsea export cables and 55km of onshore cables for the East Anglia TWO offshore wind farm in the North Sea;
